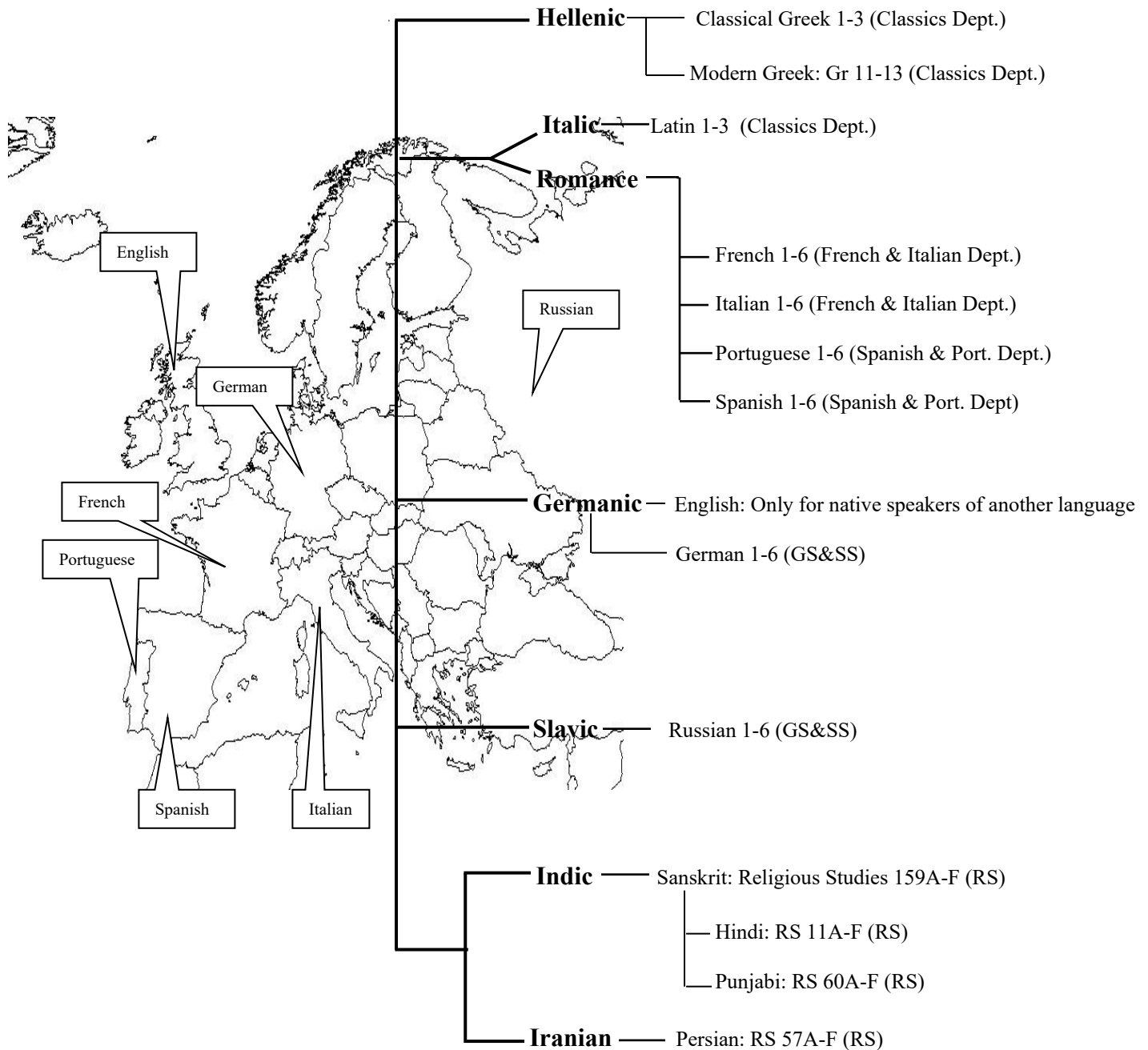


Languages taught at UCSB

A guide by family for linguistics majors

The Linguistics department requires most of our majors to study two foreign languages (6 quarters & 3 quarters or equivalent), with the following proviso “Students are encouraged to take at least one language outside of the Indo-European family; however, the study of two Indo-European languages will satisfy this requirement provided both are not members of either the Germanic, Slavic, or Romance families.” The following family tree diagram lists languages taught at UCSB that will fulfill the requirement, giving department & course number and showing what languages belong to what families. (For anything that is not listed consult the Linguistics Undergraduate Advisor). For all languages be sure to check with the department for availability; some classes are not offered on a regular basis.

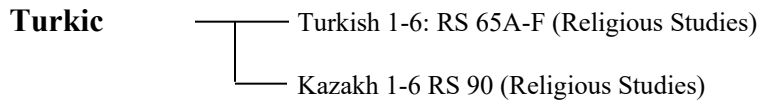
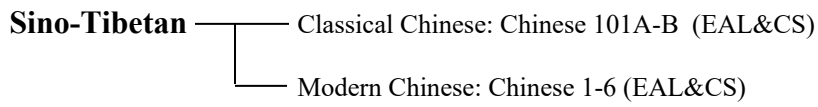
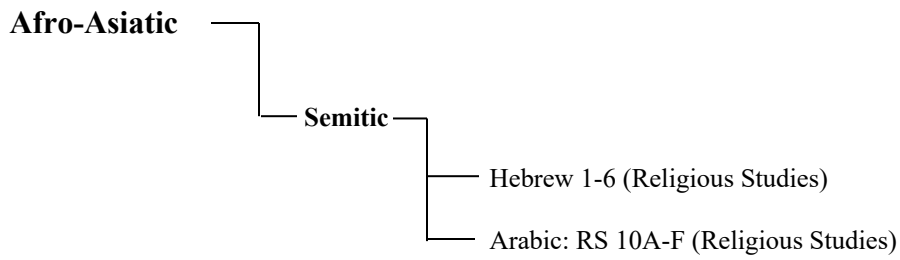
